Severe Weather Outlook Southern Plains

- Beginning later in the day Tuesday, an active period of weather is in store for the Plains, including Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas.
- A chance of either severe storms or flash flooding looks very possible each day this week.
- More than 3 million people have been placed under a level 2 out of 5 threat of severe weather on NOAA's Storm
 - Prediction Center's risk scale. This includes cities such as Lubbock, Amarillo, Midland and Odessa in Texas, and Wichita in Kansas.
- Hail and damaging winds will be the main threats from any severe thunderstorms that develop Tuesday afternoon, but there is also a low chance of some tornadoes.
- Rainfall through Friday for the central plains will amount to a widespread 2-3 inches with some locations seeing closer to 3-5 inches.

Severe Weather Activity Mississippi (Apr 2-6)

- The Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA), along with state and local officials, continues to respond to the severe weather that struck the state on April 2 through April 6, 2025.
- The National Weather Service has confirmed that at least 14 tornadoes touched down in Mississippi between April 2nd and April 6th.
- This includes two EF-3 tornadoes located in Tate County and Marshall County, along with five EF-2 tornadoes, six EF-1 tornadoes, and one EF-0 tornado.
- MEMA has received reports of damage to 414 homes, 14 businesses, and 20 farms statewide. Of the homes affected, 54 were destroyed, while 68 sustained major damage.
