

Atmospheric River West Coast

- The Pacific Northwest will get locked into a wet and windy pattern this week, as a series of storms push onshore.
- A strong atmospheric river will pump tons of moisture ashore from Seattle to San Francisco through the Thursday timeframe.
- From northern California to northern Washington, widespread rainfall totals will range from 3 to 7 inches.



- There will be a threat of flash flooding, as relentless rain pushes in.
- The heaviest rainfall and highest rainfall totals are expected mainly across northern California through midday Thursday.
- The Snoqualmie River in Washington is already running high because of an atmospheric river that impacted the region over the weekend.
- Heavy rain, mountain snow and potential mudslides will be a threat, especially in burn scar areas.
- Some areas are expected to receive 5 to 8 inches of additional rainfall, on top of what has already fallen.
- Winds could gust at least 45 miles per hour or more in the lower elevations.
