June 25, 2025

Severe Weather Outlook

Northern Tier

- Rounds of severe storms will continue across the central and northern tier of the U.S. on Wednesday.
- These "ring of fire" storms will pop up with daytime heating into the afternoon, delivering rounds of potentially severe thunderstorms across areas from the Plains eastward into the mid-Atlantic.
- Damaging winds, small hail and a few tornadoes are possible.
- On Thursday, severe storms will once again be possible across the Midwest and Southeast.
- Storms will likely form in clusters, which could merge quickly and enhance the wind threat as they move east.
- Due to the slow-moving nature of these storms, several inches of rain could fall, raising the risk of flash flooding. Widespread 3-5 inches of rain is likely for the northern Plains and Upper Midwest.



Southeast

- Strong daytime heating and a very humid environment will enhance instability from Virginia through Florida resulting in daily afternoon storm chances through late week, the FOX Forecast Center said.
- Wednesday, damaging winds will be the biggest severe storm threat.
- Some forecast models suggest that a line of severe storms will develop in the Carolinas and race southwestward toward the Florida Panhandle.
- A chance of flash flooding exists across the central and eastern Gulf Coast and Florida Panhandle. Rain totals of up to 3-5 inches are possible, especially closer to the Gulf Coast.
