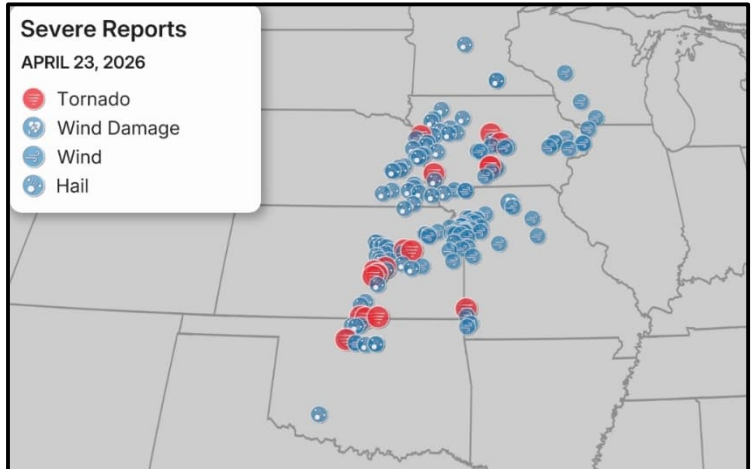

Severe Storm Activity

Plains

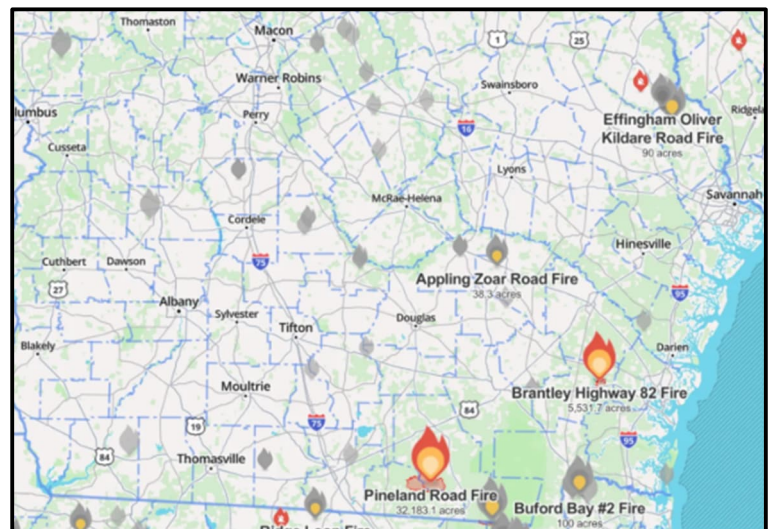
- Tornadoes swept across the Plains on Thursday night, causing widespread damage in Oklahoma, destroying neighborhoods and forcing Vance Air Force Base to close.
- Severe storms brought more than 140 reports of hail, damaging winds and at least 15 tornadoes from Oklahoma to Iowa, according to AccuWeather Senior Meteorologist Adam Douty.
- Cleanup is just beginning in Enid, Oklahoma, after a tornado tore through the city north of Oklahoma City.
- Search and rescue crews continued checking damaged homes on Friday for potential victims. No deaths have been reported from Thursday's storms, and Garfield County officials said only minor injuries were reported as of Friday morning.
- National Weather Service teams from multiple offices will be involved in damage assessments to determine the path and strength of the tornadoes from Thursday's event.



Wildfire Activity

Georgia

- Explosive wildfire activity in Georgia and across the Southeast has destroyed dozens of homes and sent people fleeing as drought conditions show no signs of improving anytime soon.
- Georgia remains under a state of emergency with a historic burn ban covering 91 counties in the southern part of the state.
- Fires have consumed thousands of acres amid exceptional drought, hot conditions and low humidity.
- Over the past week, firefighters have responded to over 100 new wildfire starts, not including larger ongoing fires.
- The Pineland Road Fire in Echols County has burned more than 32,000 acres and was 10% contained as of Friday. The fire is burning near the Florida-Georgia state line, sending heavy smoke across the region and reducing air quality.

- The second-largest fire in the state, burning along Highway 82 near Atkinson in Brantley County, has scorched about 5,500 acres and is 15% contained. Evacuations remain in place, and roads are closed around the fire, including highways 110 and 82. At least 87 structures have been destroyed.
- Due to the wildfire smoke in Georgia and northern Florida, a dense smoke advisory is in place for Brantley, Wayne, Clinch and Echols counties in southern Georgia.
- With little to no rain expected over the next 10 days in Georgia, drought conditions are likely to persist—keeping the threat of dangerous fire weather firmly in place.

Declaration Activity

Northern Mariana Islands

- On April 23, 2026, President Donald J. Trump granted a Major Disaster Declaration for the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands triggering the release of federal funds to help people and communities recover from Super Typhoon Sinlaku that occurred April 11-18, 2026.
- Individuals in the entire Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, including Saipan, Tinian, Rota, and the Northern Islands can apply with FEMA.
