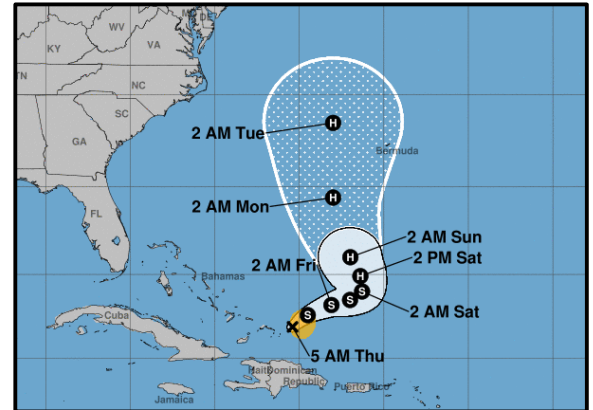

Tropical Activity

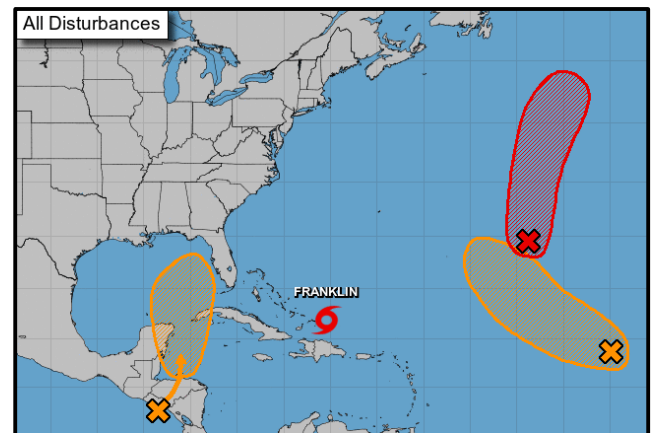
Atlantic – Tropical Storm Franklin

- The storm reached the shores of the Dominican Republic on Wednesday, lashing Hispaniola and Puerto Rico with heavy rain and 50 mph wind through the day into Thursday.
- Franklin is heading north at 13 mph and sits about 55 miles east-northeast of Grand Turk Island. It has maximum sustained winds near 50 mph with higher gusts.
- A turn to the northeast and then east-northeast with a decrease in forward speed is forecast during the next couple of days.
- On the forecast track, the center of Franklin will continue to move farther away from the Dominican Republic and over the southwestern Atlantic into the weekend.
- Gradual strengthening is forecast, and Franklin is expected to become a hurricane in a couple of days.



Atlantic – Disturbance 1

- An area of low pressure located about 1000 miles east-southeast of Bermuda (the remnants of former Tropical Storm Emily).
- This system is likely to regenerate into a tropical storm by Friday while the system moves northward over the subtropical central Atlantic.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: High (70%); 7-day: High (70%)



Atlantic – Disturbance 2

- An area of low pressure located several hundred miles west of the Cabo Verde Islands.
- Slow development is possible, and the low could become a tropical depression by the weekend while the system moves west northwestward to northwestward into the central tropical Atlantic.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (20%); 7-day: Med (40%)

Atlantic – Disturbance 3

- An area of low pressure could form in a couple of days over the northwestern Caribbean Sea.
- Some gradual development of this system is possible over the weekend and early next week, and a tropical depression could form while it moves slowly northward across the eastern Gulf of Mexico.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Med (40%)

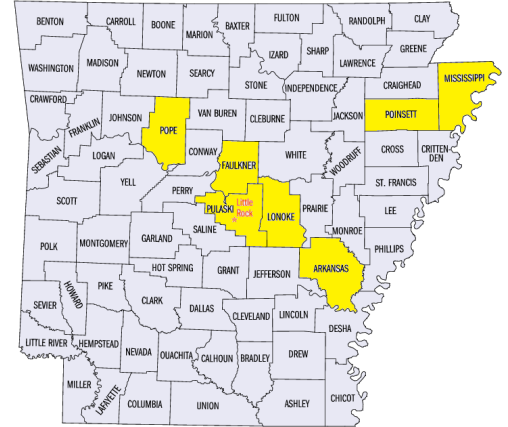

Declaration Request Arkansas

- On July 14th, Gov. Sarah Huckabee Sanders declared a disaster in six Arkansas counties following late June severe storms that brought significant damage to different areas of the state.
- Severe storms and straight-line winds on June 25 caused great damage to private property and public facilities in Arkansas, Faulkner, Lonoke, Poinsett, Pope, and Pulaski counties, Sanders said in her declaration.
- A joint state and FEMA preliminary damage assessment began on July 24 and determined that the storm caused enough damage for communities to qualify for FEMA's Public Assistance Program, according to the governor's office.
- On August 23rd, Governor Sanders requested a presidential Major Disaster Declaration in response to storms that caused severe damage in Central Arkansas and the Delta on June 25.
- The governor is requesting individual assistance that includes the Individuals and Households Program and the Crisis Counseling Program, disaster unemployment assistance, disaster case management, disaster legal services and Small Business Administration assistance in Arkansas, Faulkner, Lonoke, Mississippi, Poinsett, Pope and Pulaski counties.
- The governor also requested public assistance in seven categories (eligible projects include debris removal and work on roads and bridges, among other things), for Arkansas, Faulkner, Lonoke, Poinsett and Pulaski counties, and hazard mitigation statewide.

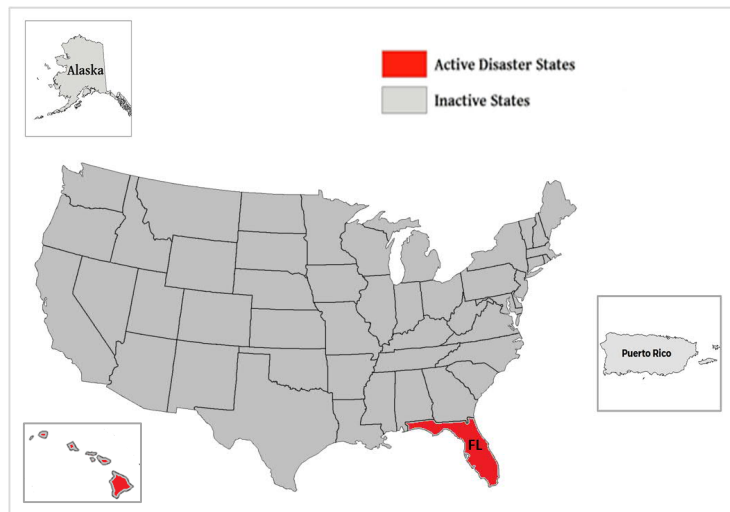
