- Formation chance 5 days: Low (30%)


Ida Updates

Louisiana

- Louisiana Sen. John Kennedy will be meeting with leaders from the Bayou Parishes Tuesday to survey Hurricane Ida storm damage.
- About 14,000 people in one Louisiana parish are without homes after Hurricane Ida damaged or destroyed 75% of the structures there, Lafourche Parish President Archie Chaisson said Monday.
- The parish remains under a curfew, and power likely won't be restored until around Sept. 29, according to regional energy provider Entergy.
- Full restoration of electricity to some of the hardest-hit areas of Louisiana battered to an unprecedented degree by Hurricane Ida could take until the end of the month, the head of Entergy Louisiana warned Sept. 4.
- One of the parishes facing long delays for power restoration is Terrebonne, where volunteers in the parish seat of Houma handed out ice, water and meals to shell-shocked storm survivors. Houma is roughly 55 miles (90 kilometers) southwest of New Orleans.
- More power was restored in the New Orleans region and southeastern Louisiana after Hurricane Aida caused widespread damage to the power grid, but more than 407,319 customers remained dark on Monday night.
- According to Entergy's website on Monday, Orleans Parish lacks more than 65,000 people and more than 142,000 are waiting for the lights to come back on in Jefferson Parish.

New York/New Jersey

- President Joe Biden Tuesday is set to survey damage in parts of the Northeast that suffered catastrophic flash flooding and devastation after remnants of Hurricane Ida swept through the region last week.
- Biden is set to tour Manville, New Jersey, and the New York City borough of Queens Tuesday afternoon.
- Biden has approved major disaster declarations, making federal aid available for people in six New Jersey counties and five New York counties affected by the devastating floods.
- Both New Jersey Gov. Phil Murphy and New York Mayor Bill de Blasio spent part of Labor Day touring damaged communities.






- Murphy said he would speak with Biden on Tuesday about adding other New Jersey counties to the disaster declaration.
- Essex County, which suffered under the effects of Hurricane Ida with flooded streets, buckled roadways and submerged downtowns, was left off the list for federal funding, drawing the ire of local, county, state and federal officials Monday.

Severe Weather Outlook Northeast

- Residents across the Northeast still recovering from the disastrous impacts caused by Tropical Rainstorm Ida last week should be on alert for showers and thunderstorms that could trigger additional flooding this week.
- Showers will first arrive in Ohio, northwestern Pennsylvania and western New York in the morning hours of Wednesday. Throughout the day,
 - thunderstorms could develop as the front pushes across the Northeast.



- While an inch of rain is not an excessive amount on a typical late-summer or early fall day, the recent heavy rain across the Northeast will make many areas more susceptible to flooding.
- Since Aug. 1, New York City has recorded more than 300 percent of the city's normal rainfall.
 Other cities such as Boston and Washington, D.C., have had more than 200 percent of their normal rainfall.

Declaration Activity DR-4615 New York

- On Monday, President Joe Biden signed a declaration to pump out federal funds to the local level, which will help New Yorkers in dire need.
- The counties covered by the declaration for individual and public assistance include Bronx, Queens, Kings, Richmond and Westchester.
- Gov. Kathy Hochul estimates 1,200 New York homes were seriously impacted by the storm, equating to well over \$50 million in damage.
