


All Disturbances

## Tropical Activity Atlantic – Disturbance 1

- A low-pressure system located about 380 miles eastsoutheast of the Leeward Islands is producing disorganized showers and thunderstorms.
- Environmental conditions are expected to be conducive for some development over the next few days, and a tropical depression could form while the low moves WNW at about 15 mph.
- The disturbance is forecast to reach portions of the Lesser Antilles by late tonight, then move near the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico on Tuesday.



- Heavy rains and flooding are likely for the Leeward Islands, Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico.
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (70%).
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%).

## Atlantic – Disturbance 2

- Disorganized showers and thunderstorms have changed little in association with an elongated low-pressure area located about 1000 miles east of the Lesser Antilles.
- Development of this system is becoming less likely during the next few days while it moves toward
- the west or west-southwest at around 10 mph.
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%).
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%).

## Wildfire Activity California – Dixie Fire

- The Dixie Fire's rapid growth continued through Sunday night with more than 489,000 acres now scorched, according to Cal Fire. The fire was still only 21% contained.
- The number of structures completely destroyed has now grown to 627, while 42 more were damaged. Cal Fire has more than 5,800 personnel assisting in the firefight.
- Around 39% of residents in Plumas County, California, are under evacuation orders as officials battle the second largest fire in state history, the Plumas County Sheriff's Office said on Sunday.
- Plumas is one of four counties -- along with Butte, Lassen and Tehama -- under the intense blaze of the Dixie Fire, which has been raging for 25 days and increased in activity Sunday amid hot, dry and windy conditions, according to Cal Fire.
- As of Sunday, no deaths were reported in connection with the fire, but four people are unaccounted for, according to the Plumas County Sheriff's Office.
