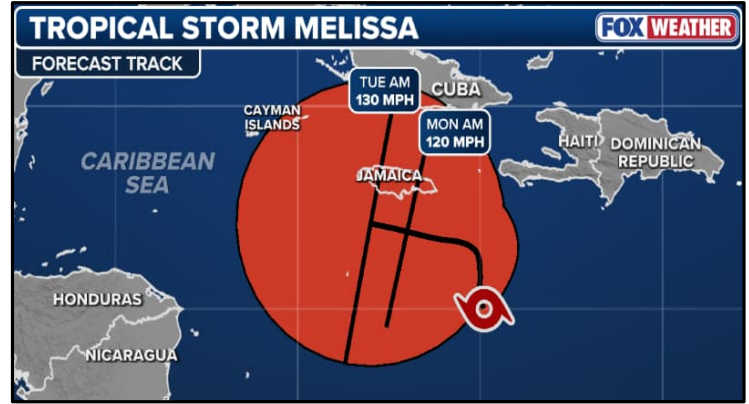

Be ovTropical Activity

Tropical Storm Melissa

- Millions of people in Jamaica, Haiti and the Dominican Republic are preparing for flooding rain and high winds as Tropical Storm Melissa, now forecast to become a Category 4 hurricane, meanders in the central Caribbean.
- The National Hurricane Center (NHC) said Melissa could become a hurricane by Friday and intensify into a major hurricane with 130-mph winds by Tuesday.
- The Meteorological Service of Jamaica said rainfall is likely to cover most of the island, with eastern parishes and some southern parishes seeing between 8 and 12 inches of rainfall.
- Currently located about 300 miles to the southwest of Port-au-Prince, Haiti, and about 240 miles to the south-southeast of Kingston, Jamaica.
- Tropical Storm Melissa has maximum sustained winds of 50 mph with some higher gusts, and it is crawling off to the west-northwest at 3 mph. Tropical-storm-force winds extend 115 miles from the storm's center.
- Slow movement is expected to continue along with a gradual turn to the northwest and north over the next few days, followed by a turn back to the west by the end of this week.



Atmospheric River Outlook

Northwest U.S.

- The Pacific Northwest will face an even more powerful atmospheric river that is set to slam into the region beginning Friday.
- This upcoming atmospheric river could drop several inches of rain in coastal areas and several feet of snow at higher elevations when all is said and done.
- New forecasts suggest that the more intense portion of the storm may have shifted farther south, with the strongest impacts targeting southern Oregon and Northern California.
- Cities including San Francisco and Eureka in California and Medford, Oregon, will see the most intense part of the storm on Saturday and Sunday.
- By the end of the week, some parts of Washington could see between 5 and 8 inches of rain, with more widespread areas across the Pacific Northwest picking up between 1 and 3 inches.
- The heaviest rainfall is forecasted between Friday and Saturday.
