Tropical Activity

Central Pacific – Hurricane Calvin (CAT 1)

- Currently located 1035 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico with maximum sustained winds 105 mph; moving W at 16 mph.
- Some additional strengthening is forecast during the next day or so; gradual weakening forecast to begin by the weekend.
- Hurricane force winds extend 25 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend 115 miles.



Flood Risk

Northeast

- The FOX Forecast Center is tracking a series of disturbances that could make for a soggy and sometimes stormy weekend for communities in the Northeast.
- The highest rainfall totals are expected to occur over southern New England, where some communities could see upwards of 5" of rain through Monday.
- Cities that experienced deadly flooding over the past week in Vermont and New York could see additional rainfall, but forecast models show the heaviest precipitation will remain along the I-95 corridor.
- Cities that could see some of the heaviest rainfall include Boston; Hartford, Connecticut; Providence, Rhode Island and Portland, Maine.
- At least three rounds of downpours and thunderstorms will likely progress slowly from the central Appalachians to the mid-Atlantic coast and New England.

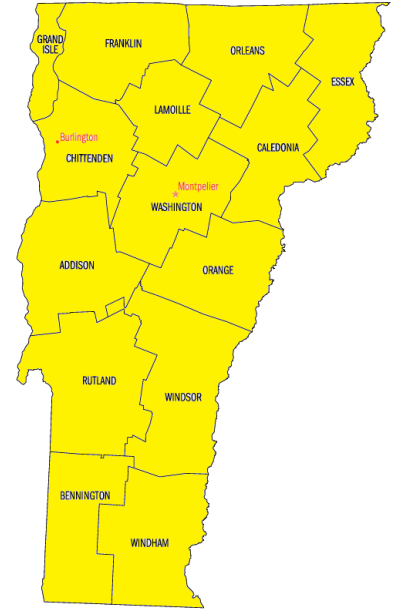

Declaration Request

Vermont

- Communities are cleaning up from the floods that were more destructive in some places than 2011's Tropical Storm Irene and regarded as the worst natural disaster since the 1927 floods, which killed dozens of people and caused widespread destruction.
- Search and rescue operations have been completed in all 14 counties.
- 18 dams are being monitored by the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation.
- Vermont authorities confirmed the first flood-related death in the state following catastrophic rain on Wednesday.
- Governor Phil Scott has made a formal request to President Joseph R. Biden for federal disaster funds to assist individuals and communities recover from the historic flood from July 7-12, 2023.
- The Major Disaster Declaration would provide relief to individuals and communities. He is requesting individual assistance in all 14 counties.
- Governor Scott didn't want to guess at the potential total cost of the flood damage, saying there is still so much damage state officials haven't seen yet. "It's significant," he said.
