

Tropical Activity

Atlantic – Disturbance 1

- An area of disturbed weather in the northern Gulf of Mexico is unlikely to become a tropical depression, but it still poses threats of heavy rainfall, lightning, and rip currents.
- On Tuesday, pockets of heavy rain produced street flooding in the Panama City, Florida, and Slidell, Louisiana, area.
- Additional heavy rain could produce more areas of localized flooding through the end of the week, particularly from coastal Louisiana into the Florida Panhandle.
- New Orleans, Biloxi, Mississippi, Mobile, Alabama, and Pensacola, Florida, are some of the cities that should monitor their forecast closely and be aware of possible flooding.
- Moisture from this system will also enhance rainfall in other parts of the Southeast over the next few days as it gets drawn ahead of an approaching front, from Alabama into Georgia and the Carolinas.
- The setup this week will also raise the risk of dangerous rip currents along parts of the northern Gulf Coast.
- A high risk of rip currents is expected for beaches along the Alabama and Florida Panhandle coasts, according to the National Weather Service.
