



January 28, 2026

Winter Storm Gianna Outlook

- A nor'easter is forecast off the East Coast for this upcoming weekend and is looking increasingly likely to develop into a bomb cyclone.
- There is growing confidence in major snow slamming the Carolinas and Virginia, but from there, uncertainty remains regarding exactly where the storm tracks.
- Friday night: Snow could start in parts of the Southeast as low pressure organizes off the Southeast coast.
- Saturday: The storm gains strength along the Southeast coast with snow, wind increasing.
- Sunday: Storm reaches peak intensity with strong winds, potentially heavy snow, coastal flooding.
- Sunday night and Monday: After lingering in at least parts of eastern New England Sunday night, the storm moves away by Monday.



Winter Storm Fern

- More than 380,000 customers remain without power this morning as the death toll from Winter Storm Fern rises. At least 41 deaths in 13 states are now blamed on the snow, ice, freezing rain and dangerously cold temperatures.
- Today, there could be some slight relief for people without electricity and heat in the South, as temperatures should rise above freezing Louisiana, Mississippi and Tennessee.

Texas

- The Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) has begun cataloguing the damage from the winter storm and is asking residents to help.
- The TDEM has opened an iSTAT Damage Survey for the winter storm, where businesses and residents can log the amount of damage their homes or other property suffered.
- ARC operations across Texas remain steady, with 24 total shelters supporting 351 clients statewide.
- There are currently over 18K customers without power.

Louisiana

- Louisiana's death toll from Winter Storm Fern rose to eight Jan. 27 as state and local officials worked to restore free flowing traffic on Interstate 20, free flowing water where systems have failed and power to nearly 100,000 people who remained without electricity.
- Gov. Jeff Landry traveled to Ouachita Parish on Tuesday to survey damage in northeastern Louisiana, where all of rural East Carroll Parish residents were without power and water, and the hub city of Monroe lost water for much of Monday.

- 34 shelters open with 660 occupants.
- There are currently over 77K customers without power.

Mississippi

- This extreme winter storm has killed a fourth person in Mississippi.
- Damage assessments and power restoration efforts continue in Mississippi after winter storms and subfreezing temperatures slammed the state.
- There are approximately 120,000 customers without power.
- 12 shelters open with 444 occupants.
- Counties continue to conduct damage assessments. The Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) has received reports of 92 homes, 3 businesses, and 7 farms damaged statewide. Those numbers are expected to rise as damage assessments continue over the coming days.

Tennessee

- At the height of the storm, Nashville Electric Service alone reported more than 230,000 outages, marking the largest single power failure in its history.
- Middle and West Tennessee were hit especially hard, with entire neighborhoods left without heat as ice coated lines and branches buckled under the weight.
- There are currently over 130,000 customers without power across the state.
- The Tennessee Department of Health has confirmed eight weather-related fatalities.
- 13 shelters open with 802 occupants.

Kentucky

- There are over 15K reported power outages, primarily in southern and southeastern Kentucky, down from around 73K at the height of outages Sunday.
- Over 950 people sheltered in warming centers Monday night. Kentucky currently has 130 warming centers set up across the commonwealth for those facing an outage.
- Dangerously cold temperatures are forecast to continue through this week. A cold weather advisory continues through tonight with dangerous wind chills for days to come.
