

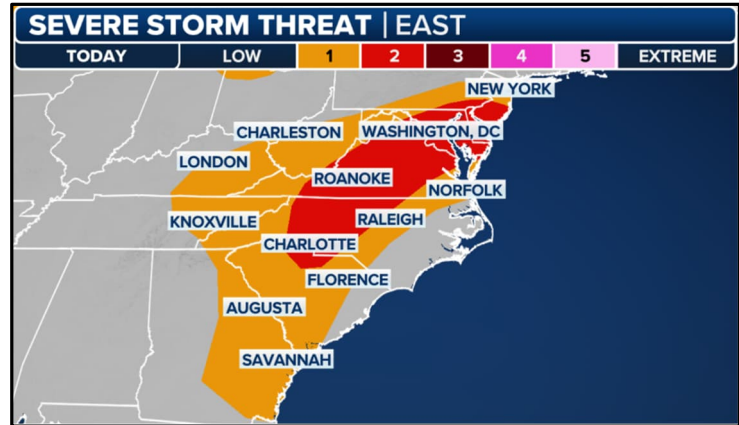

July 9, 2025

## Severe Weather Activity Eastern U.S.

- A sweltering hot day turned into a stormy evening across much of Washington, Philadelphia and New York City.
- Gusts reached 45-60 mph with a gust of 70 mph clocked in Kingstown, Maryland, according to the National Weather Service.
- About 35,000 people lost power Tuesday, mostly in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, according to FindEnergy.com.
- A renewed severe weather threat returns on Wednesday though the focus will shift south a bit.
- NOAA's Storm Prediction Center has issued a severe weather threat from Philadelphia south through Washington and into the heart of North Carolina.
- Damaging wind gusts and large hail are the primary threats.



## Flooding Activity New Mexico

- Homes in New Mexico have been destroyed and search and rescue operations are underway after catastrophic and historic flooding.
- The flooding left people trapped in homes and prompted multiple water rescues in Ruidoso, a mountain town about 180 miles southeast of Albuquerque, in the Sierra Blanca Mountain range.
- The National Weather Service office in Albuquerque said that the Rio Ruidoso reached a provisional crest of 20.24 feet.
- The river rose 19 feet in just 30 minutes.
- The FOX Forecast Center said that the flooding came as a result of 1.5-3.5 inches of rain falling on the nearby South Fork burn scar in just a few hours.
- At the peak of the event, more than 1.5 inches of rain fell in one hour.
- A Flash Flood Emergency was issued for Lincoln County on Tuesday afternoon, and dozens of reports of flash flooding were received by late Tuesday night.
- Emergency crews conducted 50-60 swift water rescues during the disaster, and search and rescue operations were ongoing as of Wednesday morning.
- The Ruidoso Community Center has been opened as a temporary shelter for displaced residents.
- More rain and isolated thunderstorms are possible again in New Mexico on Wednesday
