January 2, 2026

Flash Flood Threat California

- The Greater Los Angeles area is on alert for mudslides and flash flooding this weekend as heavy rain falls surrounding recent wildfire burn scars.
- Evacuation warnings were lifted across the Los Angeles area, but flood watches remain in effect.
- As of early Thursday morning, the NWS office in Los Angeles reported the highest rain totals in Ventura County, with up to 4.85 inches in Ortega Hill.
- Rain totals reached up to 1.21 inches in Bel Air and just under an inch in downtown LA.
- The FOX Forecast Center said another widespread 1 to 2 inches of rain appears likely across much of the region through Friday.
- A larger and potentially more impactful storm is expected to move into Northern and Central California on Friday into Saturday.
- This system could bring gusty winds, heavy rainfall and another round of mountain snow to the Sierra Nevada.
- Almost the entire coastal region of California is now under a low-end flash flood risk Friday through Monday morning.
- The threat extends from Redding, California, to San Francisco through Santa Barbara.
