## Severe Weather & Flood Outlook South

- A potent storm system that has triggered severe weather alerts across the Southeast on Thursday continues to slowly move through the region, where severe weather and life-threatening flooding is expected to continue through Saturday.
- The initial round of storms developed across the Southern Plains where several communities reported hail the size of quarters. Flooding was also witnessed outside of Fort Worth, Texas.
- Multiple rounds of storms are possible throughout the day Friday. The early day storms will tend to favor a large hail threat across central Texas.
- But storms that develop during the afternoon and evening across Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and the Florida Panhandle will have a greater threat for a tornado. Large hail and damaging wind gusts over 60 mph are possible in severe storms as well.
- The abundance of strong low-level wind shear will help sustain severe thunderstorms after sunset.
- Aside from severe thunderstorms, flash flooding remains a concern in much of Alabama, Georgia and even into South Carolina.
- Flood Watches have been issued for portions of Alabama and a large section of Georgia, which includes around 11 million people.
