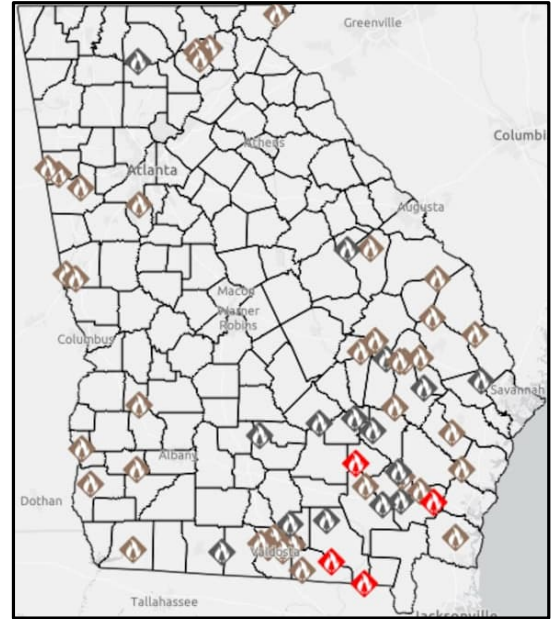

Wildfire Activity

Georgia

The Pineland Road Fire

- Ignited on April 19, 2026, in Clinch County, Georgia, near the Georgia-Florida line, and has heavily impacted neighboring Echols County.
- As of the latest updates within the last 72 hours, the fire has burned approximately 32,573 acres and is currently 23% contained.
- The fire is primarily fueled by dry pine trees, heavy vegetation, and highly combustible downed timber left over from Hurricane Helene in 2024.
- It has grown rapidly due to extremely dry vegetation and persistent exceptional drought conditions.
- The Georgia Forestry Commission (GFC) is leading suppression efforts alongside local cooperators and over 20 fire departments from across South Georgia.
- Crews are working around the clock to build, reinforce, and secure containment lines along Highway 94, U.S. Highway 441, Thelma Headlight Road, and Will Rewis Road.
- FEMA has authorized federal funds to reimburse up to 75% of the costs for firefighting efforts, and a State of Emergency has been declared by the Governor.
- A mandatory evacuation order is in effect for residents of the Fruitland area in Echols County, as well as residents living on or near Will Rewis Road, Chauncey Road, Joes Lane, Worth Lane, and Register Road.



The Hwy 82 Fire

- Ignited on April 21, 2026, near Nahunta and the Highway 82 corridor in Brantley County, Georgia.
- As of April 30, 2026, the fire has burned approximately 22,600 acres and is 33% contained.
- Initially reported at around 600 acres, the fire exhibited extreme and rapid growth, doubling in size over its first weekend.
- It is heavily fueled by exceptional drought conditions, tinder-dry pine woods, and a massive amount of dead and downed timber left over from 2024's Hurricane Helene.
- Over 443 personnel are currently responding, utilizing helicopters (including U.S. Army Black Hawks), engines, tractor plows, and bulldozers.
- Light rains and excellent humidity recovery over the last 72 hours have allowed crews to significantly increase containment from 6% to 33%, extinguishing hot spots around structures and reinforcing dozer lines.

- Mandatory evacuations remain in place for several areas in Brantley County, including properties within the boundaries of Highway 32 (North), Highway 82 (South), Highway 110 (West), and Post Road (East).
- Brantley County has enacted a mandatory curfew from 8:30 PM to 6:30 AM in the evacuated areas.
