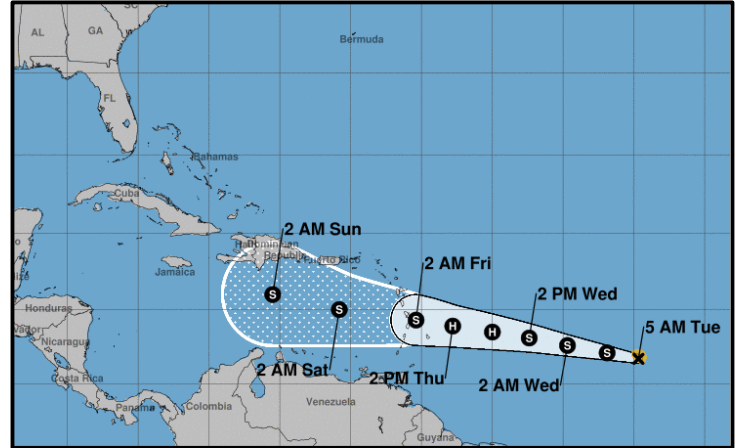

## Tropical Activity

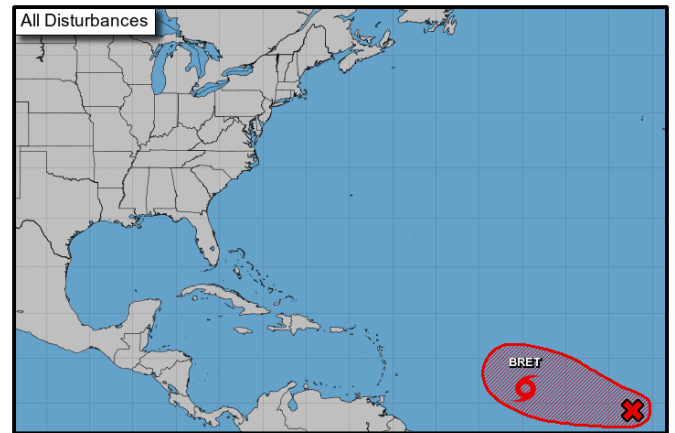
### Atlantic – Tropical Storm Bret

- Tropical Storm Bret formed over the central Atlantic Ocean on Monday in an unusual development for the basin at this time of the year.
- Bret, currently a tropical storm with maximum sustained winds of 40 mph, is expected to strengthen in the coming days.
- "Bret could become a hurricane in a couple of days," the National Hurricane Center said in its update on Tuesday morning. If that does happen, Bret — which is currently the second named storm of the Atlantic hurricane season — would be the first named hurricane of the season.
- The storm is expected to approach the Lesser Antilles islands "by late this week," the national forecasting service said. The Lesser Antilles are comprised of numerous island nations and territories, including the U.S. Virgin Islands, Antigua and Barbuda, Aruba, and Trinidad and Tobago, among others.
- "Bret is forecast to initially strengthen and then move across the Lesser Antilles near hurricane intensity on Thursday and Friday, bringing a risk of flooding from heavy rainfall, strong winds, and dangerous storm surge and waves," the National Hurricane Center said Tuesday morning.
- "Given the larger than usual uncertainty in the track forecast, it is too early to specify the location and magnitude of where these hazards could occur. However, everyone in the Lesser Antilles, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands should closely monitor updates to the forecast for Bret and have their hurricane plan in place."



### Atlantic – Disturbance 1

- Showers and thunderstorms are gradually showing signs of organization in association with a tropical wave located several hundred miles southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands.
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for further development of this system, and a tropical depression will likely form during the next couple of days while the system moves westward at 10 to 15 mph across the eastern and central tropical Atlantic.
- Formation chance - 48 hours: High (70%); 7-day: High (80%)
