Severe Storm Outlook East U.S.

- Washington, D.C., Philadelphia and New York City will likely see periods of heavy rain in addition to potentially damaging wind gusts beginning Tuesday afternoon.
- FOX Forecast Center states rain rates could reach up to 2 inches per hour on Tuesday.



- The intensity of the rain has prompted Flash Flood Watches for parts of the Northeast and mid-Atlantic beginning Tuesday afternoon.
- Main threats are expected to be damaging wind gusts and small hail.
- NOAA's Weather Prediction Center (WPC) has issued a Flash Flood Risk covering an area from Richmond, Virginia to Boston.
- The flood threat will last through Wednesday morning.

Flooding Activity

North Carolina

- At least 3 people were reported dead after floods caused by the remnants of Tropical Storm Chantal affected North Carolina on Sunday, July 6.
- The National Weather Service confirmed on Monday that at least 4 tornadoes touched down as Chantal moved across North Carolina.
- Tornadoes impacted several locations, including Sanford at the Raleigh Executive Jetport, Moncure, Pittsboro Road area, Heartpine Drive in Mebane, and Mount Hermon Rock Creek Road in Snow Camp, Alamance County.
- Rainfall exceeded 8 to 10 inches in Chatham, Alamance, and Orange counties.
- States of emergency were declared in Alamance, Moore, and Orange counties.
- The Eno River crested at 25.63 feet early on Monday in Durham along with the Haw River which crested at 32.5 feet early on Monday in the Town of Haw River.
- In Orange County, the possibility of the failure of the Lake Michael Dam prompted officials to issue a voluntary evacuation for areas downstream overnight.
- More than 34,000 customers were without power on Monday morning, according to poweroutage.us.
- Governor Josh Stein will be visiting central North Carolina to survey flood damage caused by Tropical Storm Chantal.

<u>Texas</u>

- Search and rescue operations in central Texas entered their fifth day on Tuesday after heavy rainfall overwhelmed the Guadalupe River.
- The death toll stood at at least 104.
- Flooding came in the early morning hours, with rainfall causing the nearby Guadalupe River to surge



over 26 feet in less than an hour, according to Texas Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick.

- President Donald Trump said he will visit Texas on Friday.
- According to the FOX Forecast Center, rounds of heavy precipitation and thunderstorms are expected to continue across south-central Texas through at least Tuesday, with new Flood Watches and Flood Warnings in place through at least Monday night.
- Storms that develop across portions of Texas will be capable of producing more flash flooding very quickly given how saturated the ground.
- NOAA's Weather Prediction Center placed a large portion of south-central Texas in a flash flood threat zone Monday.
- The FOX Forecast Center said that the Guadalupe River in Bloomington, Texas, more than 200 miles downstream from Hunt, Texas, is not forecast to reach minor flood stage until at least Wednesday.
