

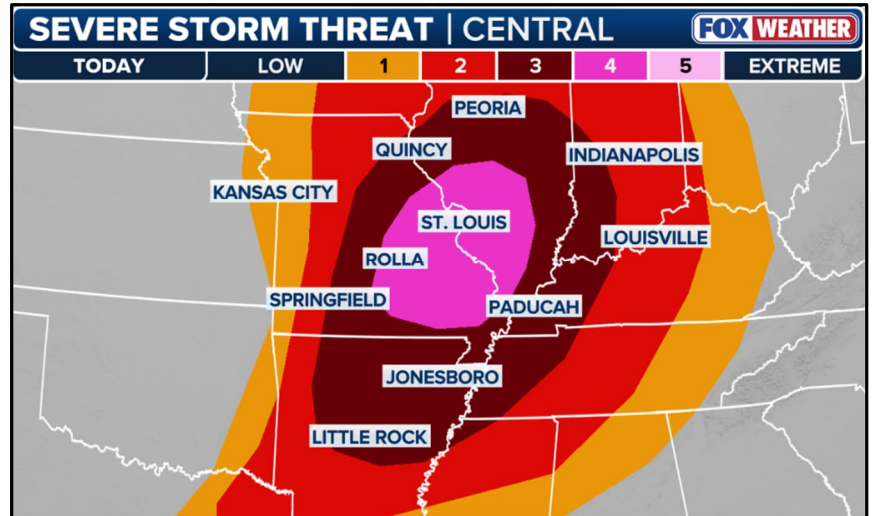

## Severe Storm Outlook Central U.S.

- There's potential for a high-end tornado outbreak for parts of the Mid-Mississippi Valley Monday, as a broader severe weather threat targets more than 60 million people from southern Minnesota to parts of the South, including Arkansas, northern Mississippi and northern Alabama.
- Whether that outbreak materializes will be largely dependent on ongoing thunderstorm activity and how long cloud cover will remain over Missouri, Illinois and Indiana early Monday.
- Ongoing morning storms may limit afternoon storm development where they persist, but there is increasing confidence in a corridor of undisturbed air that could support the development of potentially intense EF-3+ tornadoes.
- This has prompted the Storm Prediction Center to issue a Level 4 out of 5 severe weather risk for southeast Missouri and southwest Illinois.
- Some major cities in the Level 4 threat zone include St. Louis; Cape Girardeau, Rolla and Poplar Bluff, Missouri; and Mount Vernon, Illinois.
- This is the latest severe weather threat in a relentless outbreak that began last Thursday, which produced a destructive EF-4 in Enid, Oklahoma, and twisters that killed at least two people in Runaway Bay, Texas late Saturday.
- Sunday's severe weather threat produced large hail and damaging wind gusts across Kansas, Oklahoma and parts of North Texas.
- Severe thunderstorms were ongoing early Monday with quarter-sized hail, heavy rain and winds gusts up to 70 mph were recorded moving through Kansas City, Missouri. Strong storms also swept through St. Louis.
- Heavy rain from these storms also produced flash flooding across parts of Kansas and Missouri, with a swath of 3 to 5 inches of total rainfall through Tuesday morning.
- If cloud cover clears early enough over the Midwest, the atmosphere will reload, creating an even more dangerous severe weather threat Monday afternoon.
- This would create prime conditions for long-track tornadoes (EF-3+) across Missouri, Illinois, Indiana and western Kentucky.

## Wildfire Activity Update Georgia

- Historic drought has created dangerous and challenging conditions for firefighters battling massive deadly wildfires across Georgia and Florida this week, with very little likelihood of rain to ease the fire danger.
- Firefighters in Georgia continue to battle two large wildfires that, combined, total more than 50,000 acres.
- Extreme fire danger remains in Brantley County, Georgia, as the wildfire more than doubled on Saturday, burning 20,933 acres as of Sunday, according to officials.
- Evacuations expanded on Sunday, as the fire continued to push into the north and northeast.
- The Highway 82 Fire is 7% contained as of Sunday.
- The Pineland Road Fire also continues to rage across south Georgia, burning more than 32,000 acres roughly 45 miles east of Valdosta.
- The fire was 10% contained as of Saturday, the Georgia Forestry Commission said.
- In total, 122 homes have been destroyed, according to officials. In Brantley County, 87 homes were destroyed, while 35 homes have been lost in Clinch County.
- Earlier last week, Georgia Governor Brian Kemp declared a state of emergency across 91 counties and enacted the first mandatory burn ban in the state's history over the next 30 days.
