Snow Forecast Eastern U.S.

- Two more rounds of snow are expected later this week across the winter-weary eastern U.S., including parts of the Ohio Valley, Mid-Atlantic and Northeast.
- While neither storm is expected to pack accumulations approaching last week's historic winter storm, the second of the upcoming two systems will be accompanied by wind gusts that could cause travel delays alongside the unshakable arctic chill that has many cities across the East.
- A weak clipper system will dive out of Canada and tap into moisture streaming north from the Gulf, bringing a coating of snow from parts of Indiana east through New Jersey on Tuesday night into Wednesday.
- According to the FOX Forecast Center, snow totals are expected to stay around an inch or less.
- A stronger clipper is expected to move across the Great Lakes and Northeast late Thursday, with parts of the Interstate 95 corridor likely seeing snow beginning sometime Friday afternoon into early Saturday.
- 1-3 inches of snow are expected across the Great Lakes and Northeast, with higher amounts favored in elevated terrain, according to the FOX Forecast Center.



Winter Storm Gianna

- Freeze and extreme cold warnings were in place across much of the East and Southeast Monday morning, after a weekend of heavy snow and bone-chilling temperatures from Winter Storm Gianna.
- The powerful bomb-cyclone brought near-blizzard conditions to portions of the Carolinas and southern Virginia.
- More than 100,000 homes and businesses remain without power, according to PowerOutage.us. Mississippi and Tennessee are reporting the highest outages with Louisiana and Florida not far behind.
- The weekend's bomb cyclone is blamed for at least four deaths: one in Georgia, one in Tennessee and two in North Carolina.
- Flight cancellations exceeded 2,800 in the U.S. on Saturday, with at least another 1,800 on Sunday, according to FlightAware, a flight tracking and data company.

- The highest reports were a total of a total of 22.5 inches of snow at Faust, in the North Carolina mountains.
- With 11 inches of snow, Charlotte, North Carolina saw the fourth-highest 1-day snowfall in the city's history.
- Over the weekend, winter conditions contributed to more than 1,000 crashes in North Carolina and 300 in Virginia, according to state troopers.
- As the sun came up on Sunday, preliminary estimates for this new storm place total damage and economic loss between \$13 to \$15 billion.
