Flood Activity

California

- At least three people are dead and hundreds of landslides and mudslides have been reported in the wake of a powerful atmospheric river storm that lashed California with torrential rain and hurricane-force wind gusts over the past few days.
- Southern California, including the Los Angeles area, felt the brunt of the storm.
- Los Angeles received more than 7 inches of rain between Sunday and Monday – the third-highest two-day rainfall total on record. The city averages 14.25 inches of rain annually and received half of that total in just 48 hours.
- So far, 307 landslides and mudslides were reported in the Los Angeles area alone, according to the Los Angeles Fire Department. Canyon roads north of Sunset Boulevard and south of Mulholland Drive were hardest hit.
- Among the damage: At least 35 buildings require inspection to ensure they are safe. At least five buildings have been declared unsafe to enter, and seven others have received significant damage.
- The Department of Public Works reported more than 250 fallen trees and branches and nearly 160 potholes that opened up on roads.
- The Atmospheric River will continue to bring significant impacts to California through today. Southern California will see the most significant rainfall.
- Widespread Flood Watches and localized Flash Flood Warnings are in effect across Southern and Central California counties.
- Considerable flooding impacts are possible across portions of Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange, and San Diego counties, as well as the western Inland Empire and coastal slopes of the San Bernardino mountains, through this afternoon.
- Current Mandatory evacuations:
 - Los Angeles: 399
 - San Bernardino – 551
- Five shelters open with 77 occupants.
- Some 155,000 homes and businesses were still without power as of 3:30 a.m. PT, according to the PowerOutage.us website, which tracks energy connections nationally.
- The worst affected areas are Mendocino County, where nearly 8,000 out of 53,000 customers are having outages, and Sonoma County, where nearly 20,000 out of 178,000 customers are without power.
