Flood Activity

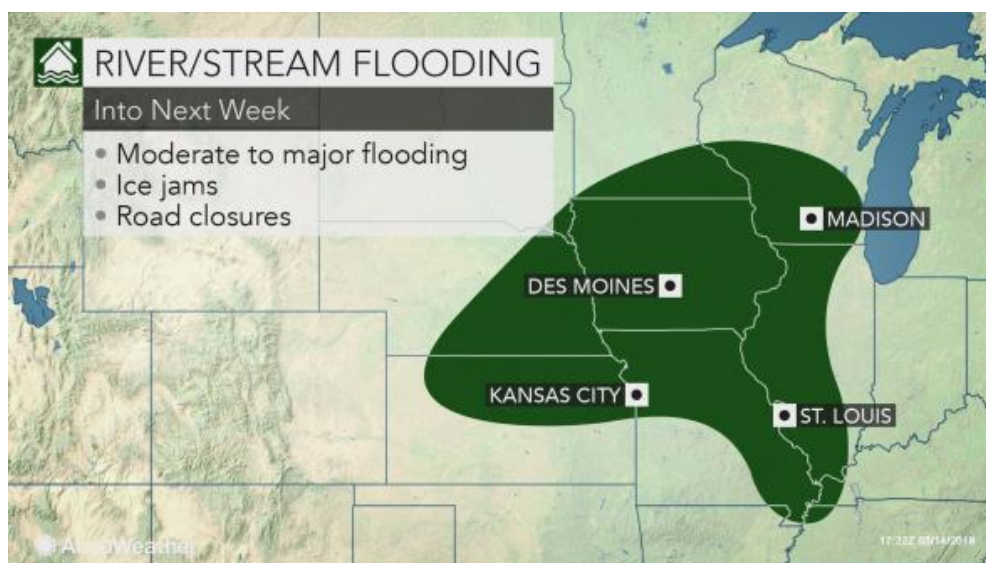
- ∅ The bomb cyclone this week has set into motion the big surge of water that will flow from the small streams to the progressively larger rivers, which are likely to be above flood stage for many weeks this spring.
- ∅ Rain and melting snow from the storm have already produced record high water levels along portions of the Boyer and Floyd rivers in Iowa and the Loup River in Nebraska.

Nebraska

- Plattsmouth, Nebraska, residents were told to restrict water use after the Plattsmouth Water Treatment Plant was inundated by rising flood waters from the Missouri River.
- A third of the 24,000 residents in Norfolk, Nebraska, were ordered to evacuate Thursday after the city's levee system "neared its top," city officials said. One person was reported missing after their car was swept away, News Channel Nebraska reported.
- Residents along the Platte River from Schuyler to Ashland, Nebraska, were told to evacuate at 11 a.m., the Omaha World-Herald reported. The National Weather Service warned that a surge of water was moving down the river because of an ice jam breakup.
- There are currently 11 shelters open with 721 occupants due to flooding.
- Nebraska Gov. Pete Ricketts had issued an Emergency Declaration on Tuesday.

Iowa

- Iowa Gov. Kim Reynolds on Thursday signed an emergency disaster proclamation that allows state resources to be used in response to flooding in the state.
- Just before 11 a.m. Thursday, the residents of Hornick in western Iowa were ordered to evacuate immediately because of a levee breach on the West Fork of the Little Sioux River.
- To the north of Hornick, the town of Molville was also inundated by flood waters.

Severe Weather Activity

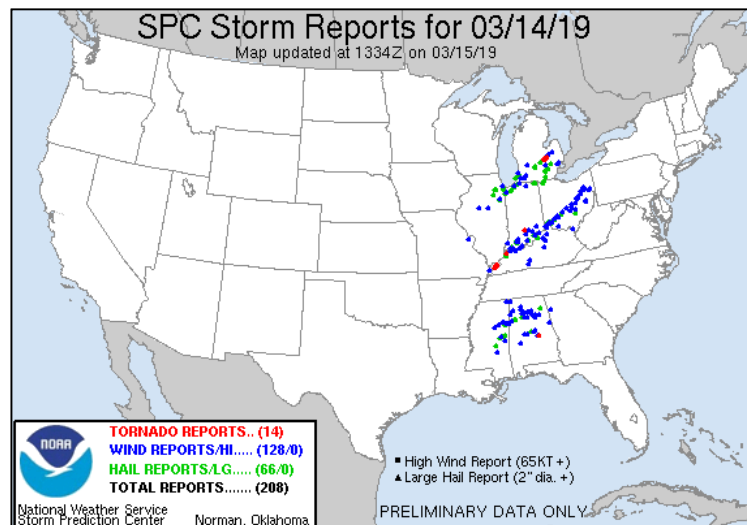
- Ø Tornadoes caused damage from Michigan to Alabama on Thursday as severe storms brought high winds and flooding rains to the Upper Midwest, the Ohio Valley and the South.

Kentucky

- A tornado touched down Thursday in Kentucky, leaving some damage and at least one injury, officials said.
- A state of emergency was declared in a western Kentucky county where the storm spread damage around a 5-square-mile (13-square kilometer) area, knocking down power lines and covering roadways in debris, officials said.
- State police said at least one injury has been reported in McCracken County from the storm. Emergency crews were going door-to-door in the area to check on residents.
- State trooper Rob Austin said it appears that dozens of homes were damaged, and high winds were continuing in the area Thursday afternoon.

Michigan

- A powerful tornado caused significant damage in Shiawassee and Genesee counties Thursday evening.
- The tornado touched down in the Durand and Vernon areas of Shiawassee County around 6:45 p.m. It moved rapidly northeast in Genesee County.
- Heavy damage was reported in Vernon Township around the intersection of Reid and Bennington roads. There were also dozens of damage reports into Clayton Township, Flushing, Flint Township and Genesee Township.
- More than 50 structures in the county sustained damage.
- As the storm continued moving northeast, it slammed into the Camelot Villas mobile home community in Genesee Township. Assistant Fire Chief Don Fremd said at least 10 to 15 trailers sustained heavy damage, including some that lost their roofs.
